

Texas Professional Land Surveying Practices Act

- Regulates practice of land surveying in Texas
- Law made by legislature
- State Agency created by Practice Acts
 - Licensing
 - Enforcement
- Registered Professional Land Surveyor (RPLS)
- Surveyor In Training (SIT)
- Similar Boards in other states



Texas Professional Land Surveying Practices Act

- Sets out the requirements for SIT, RPLS and LSLS registration
- Chapter 1071 of Texas Occupations Code
- Rules expand and explain the process from the law
- Chapter 134 of the rules
- Law and Rules documents on website: https://pels.texas.gov



TBPELS HISTORY

- Land Surveying Board was established in 1919.
- Public Surveying Board was established in 1955.
- Both surveying boards merged in 1979.
- Merged with Engineering Board in 2019 TBPELS.
- Over 6,800 Texas RPLS registrations granted since 1955.
- Currently over 2,700 Registered Surveyors.



TEXAS BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND LAND SURVEYORS

Nine Members - Appointed by Governor

- 5 Licensed Professional Engineers
- 1 Registered Professional Land Surveyor
- 3 Public Members
- 1 Ex-Officio Representative LSLS from GLO
- Standard term is 6 years

- Protection of the Public
- Competent
 - Initial Qualifications
 - Staying Current
- Ethical
- Professionalism



Benefits of Registration

- Serves as a protection of public health, safety, and welfare.
- It shows you have accomplished a recognized standard.
- Makes you equal with other professionals. Many other professions require that you are licensed or registered to practice.



Benefits of Registration

- Sets you apart from others in your profession.
 (Marketability)
- "Portable" credential you can keep throughout your career.
- Law Only RPLS can offer or perform boundary / land surveying services
- Required for Some Positions



Benefits of Registration

- Much More than Just Passing an Exam!
- Increased Responsibility and Authority.
- You Will be in Responsible Charge of Your Land Surveying Projects and Work.
- You Will be Held Accountable for Your Actions as an RPLS.





RECENT BOARD ACTIVITIES

- Rule package to update licensing rules on criminal history effective March 2023.
- Rule changes to address surveying exams effective September 2023
- Legislative Session 2025.
- Engineer and surveyor renewal fees now are \$50/year.



RECENT BOARD ACTIVITIES

- Rule Packages that have been adopted:
 - Clearer Definition of 32 Hours of Education for Land Surveyors
 - Effective Jan 1, 2026
- Clean-up Rules November
 - Most are minor
 - Removal of tape requirement for references
 - Double counting of engineering and surveying experience
 - Removal of 3x fail for PE (and PS) exam take until pass



32 HOUR EDUCATION

- Clearer Definition of 32 Hours of Education for Land Surveyors
- Original 32 hours defined in 1990's
- Educators, Surveyors, and SAC all weighed in on new definitions
- Based on Statute
- Effective Jan 1, 2026
- Must meet all qualifications before you turn in your application

Registered Professional Land Surveyor

Education - SIT

- Multiple Paths to Registration
- Based on Education
 - 4 Year Degrees
 - 2 Year Degrees
 - No Degree (HS Required)
- Set in Statute (Law) Chapter 1071
- Slight Differences between SIT and RPLS
- Experience requirement is related to education.

Education - SIT

- Occupations Code 1071.253
- For SIT:
 - Bachelor of Science in Surveying
 - Bachelor's Degree with at least 32 hours in:
 - Civil Engineering
 - Land Surveying
 - Mathematics
 - Photogrammetry
 - Forestry
 - Land Law
 - The Physical Sciences



Education - SIT

- Occupations Code 1071.253
- For SIT:
 - Associates Degree in Surveying
 - Course of Instruction with 32 hours in land surveying or related to land surveying
 - High School completion



Experience - SIT

- Varies by degree earned (1071.253):
 - Bachelor Degree in Surveying = 0 years
 - Bachelor Degree w/32 Hours = 1 year
 - Associates Degree = 2 years
 - High School = 4 years



Experience - SIT

- Requirements for Experience:
 - Experience must be obtained under the direction and guidance of one or more RPLS.
 - Experience obtained in the area of boundary surveying and boundary determination.
 - Experience is documented in the SIT application
 - RPLS references providers will verify experience.



Experience - SIT

- You Will Need to Document Your Experience.
- Maintain Records Weekly, Monthly, Yearly:
 - Surveyor Projects You Work on.
 - Surveyor Tasks You Personally Perform.
 - Who You Work for, With and Time.



Application - SIT

- SIT Application (Paper Form)
- Application Fee \$75 (Not refundable)
- Education Transcripts directly from institution
- Course Checklist
- 3 RPLS References



FS Exam - SIT

- Once application is approved the SIT candidate may register for the FS exam.
- Fundamentals of Surveying NCEES Exam.
- FS Exam may take as many times as necessary.
- FS Exam is a Computer Based Exam.



Computer Based Testing

- Price \$225
- Includes test center seat, examination, and results release
- Year-round registration and testing
- Pearson VUE testing centers
- NCEES will release results directly to examinees within 4–10 days.



Computer Based Testing

- Continuous Registration (24/7)
- Register online through NCEES.org
- Pay all exam-related fees directly to NCEES via credit card
- On exam day, attest to abide by rules and policies found in the NCEES Examinee Guide



Computer Based Testing

- Exam and references on computer
- Split screen
- 24-inch monitor
- FS references
 - Searchable
 - Available on NCEES website
- Specific Approved Calculators
- Security No Other Books or References, phones, iPads, etc.




CBT FS Exam - Format

- 6-hour test center appointment
 - Tutorial-8 minutes
- Maximum Exam time-5 hours, 20 minutes
 - Scheduled break–25 minutes

Surveyor in Training (SIT)

- Notify TBPELS after you pass the FS Exam.
- Certificate will be issued and mailed.
- Starts clock for RPLS experience.
- Certificate is good for 8 years.
- Can be renewed every 8 years
 - Renewal form
 - Pay fee
 - Document 32 hours of continuing education



Surveyor in Training (SIT)

- SIT is path to be an RPLS
- SIT cannot sign and seal



Registered Professional Land Surveyor



Registered Professional Land Surveyor (RPLS) Basic Requirements

Must hold a current Texas SIT or be Out-of-State RPLS

Education:

- Approved Bachelor's degree in Surveying, or TAC/ABET, ASAC, SACS accredited degree, or
- Bachelor degree and 32 hours of Board approved course work, or
- Associates degree and 32 hours of Board approved coursework.

Experience:

At least 2 years of SIT Boundary experience working directly for a RPLS.

References:

3 RPLS Reference Providers

Application:

Apply for approval of a Texas RPLS registration and exams.

Examinations:

National NCEES PS exam plus the Texas Surveying Specific Exam (TSSE)

Ethics:

Criminal History Record Check – Required for all RPLS as of September 1, 2020.





RPLS - APPLICATION

- RPLS Application (Paper Form)
- Application Fee \$75 (Not refundable)
- Education Transcripts directly from institution if not already on record
- Education Course Checklist (if applicable)
- Supplementary Experience Record (SER)
- 3 RPLS References (minimum)
- Criminal History Record Check (CHRC)
- Criminal History forms for prior incidents.
- Documentation of English Proficiency (if required)

Application Review and Approval

- Once your application is received you will be assigned a TBPLES licensing specialist to perform the initial review.
- Complete applications will then move to a technical review.
- We will process your application, and notify you along the way if information is missing or lacking.
- Once your application is approved you will be able to sit for the RPLS exams (TSSE and PS).



RPLS Exams Texas Specific Surveying Exam National PS Exam

- Currently all Texas TSSE and LSLS Exams are administered by the TBPELS
- The National PS Exam is administrated by NCEES
- You must have an approved application to register for the exams.
- Exam approval allows for applicant to sit for the TSSE exam 3 times before obtaining 1 additional year of experience and reapplying.



TSSE Exam

- Exam registration forms and information found on PELS website
- \$75 exam fee for each exam.
- Pencil and Paper Exams:
 - Given 3 times per year in 2024 and 2025
 - 4 hour exam covering Texas specific surveying topics.
- Be aware of application and registration deadlines.



TSSE Exam

- Exam Authorizations will be emailed ahead of the exam.
- Only approved calculators allowed.
- You must follow all exam day procedures.
- Exam grading, psychometrician evaluation, and calibration takes 6 weeks.
- Examinees will be emailed the exam results as Pass / Fail.
- Detail breakdown of individual exam performance is not available or provided.





SURVEYING EXAM STATISTICS

Future TSSE Exams:

March 7, 2025 – Austin – Norris Center - Complete

June 13, 2025 – Austin – Norris Center

October 31, 2025 - Austin - Norris Center

Registration as RPLS

- Examinees that pass both exams will be issued a RPLS number and a certificate.
- Certificates and seal instructions will be mailed to the registrant.
- RPLS must obtain a seal.
- Annual renewal and Continuing Education is required for the RPLS.
